

Who is a CPA?

CPAs are big thinkers, innovators, sustainability drivers, and so much more!

A Chartered Professional Accountant (CPA) doesn't just crunch numbers. In a world of disruptive change, CPAs create value for organizations in all industries by finding new ways to use their expertise and strategic insight to carve new paths forward.

CPAs work in organizations of every size and in every industry. Many become CEOs or presidents, or start their own businesses. CPAs are in demand in every sector, including in tech, sustainability, entertainment, consulting, and not-for-profit organizations around the world.

Steps to becoming a CPA

- 1 Graduate high school
- 2 Earn a university degree
 - Major in
 accounting
 for your
 undergraduate
 studies
- Earn an undergraduate degree in another discipline
- Take prerequisite courses (via CPA preparatory courses or post-secondary institution)
- 3 Complete the CPA Program
 - Complete the CPA Professional Education Program (approximately 24 months)
 - Write and pass the Common Final Examination
 - Obtain **practical work experience** while completing the education program

(approximately 30 months in total)

Essential skills of a CPA

CPAs aren't just known for their abilities in accounting and financial management, they are equipped with skillsets that allow them to be successful in any work environment, including the ability to:



Act ethically and demonstrate professional values



Solve problems and add value to the organization



Communicate effectively



Collaborate and lead others
