

CPAEF 2017 Accounting Academic Symposium Follow Up Questions

1. What are the ACAF National Examination Admission Requirements?

The admission requirements for ACAF are:

- Completion of the necessary prerequisite courses as outlined by the postsecondary institution (inclusive of the ACAF *entry* courses;
- Completion of the equivalent of all six ACAF technical courses; and
- Completion of the equivalent of the five ACAF *applied* courses with the following standard for achievement:
 - A passing grade or 60%, whichever is higher, in each of the intermediate financial reporting *entry* courses, *applied* courses, and all the *technical* courses with the exception of information technology;
 - o A passing grade of 50%, whichever is higher, for all other *entry* courses, information technology, and business law

There is no stated requirement for an individual to hold a diploma nor is there any requirement for the individual to have completed any practical work experience.

2. How do I apply for the CPAEF Speaker Series Funding?

The CPAEF Board considers requests for funding towards a Speaker Series event throughout the year. A business school can apply for up to \$2,500 in funding up to twice a year to support accounting faculty development.
